LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR OLASUBOMI IGINLA AINA.

Olasubomi's support of the Foreign Affairs Committee's Nigeria inquiry was invaluable. Following her relevant and well-informed submission of written evidence, in my role as the inquiry manager, I discussed with her the feasibility of holding an event for Nigerian diaspora in London. She was able to advise us on many things including how to go about ensuring the key diaspora groups were represented as well as logistics for the day. Despite the uncertainty around social distancing measures, as this was shortly after the Covid lock-downs of 2020/21 she worked hard behind the scenes to provide us with excellent recommendations and liaised with the various stakeholders upon the Chair's choice. The event was a considerable success and was highly praised by members of the Committee including its Chair at the time, Tom Tugendhat.
